Helping Members in Challenging

Times. The Village of Buffalo Narrows and the surrounding area was under a state of emergency in late May, faced with a mandatory evacuation order due to the proximity of forest fires. People were forced to leave their homes and face the unexpected costs of travel and accommodations in larger city centers like Regina, Saskatoon, and Lloydminster.

"We knew our members needed access to extra money quickly, so we set up a \$500 overdraft option for any impacted member who needed it, no credit check necessary," says Innovation VP Member Advisors, Chad Gartner. An overdraft is attached to a basic chequing account to make sure additional money is readily available without the need to make transfers. The interest rate is also considerably lower than that of a credit card. "933 people took advantage of the special offer. It meant so much to our entire staff group knowing we could make a small difference during such a stressful time."

"I am extremely proud of Innovation's fast response to this situation and the care they demonstrated for not only our staff but for our affected membership," says Innovation Manager Member Advisors Holly Congrove. "Hearing our members' stories and the expressions of appreciation for the help was an emotional experience for me, and nearly brought me to tears on more than one occasion. Our members are why we are here, why we do what we do. Seeing Responsible BankingTM in action and the difference it can make to people in need is one of the reasons I love coming to work every day."

It was also our privilege to donate \$4,000 each to the Village of Buffalo Narrows, the Village of Dillon/Buffalo River Dene Nation, and the Village of Île-à-la-Crosse. "The Île-à-la-Crosse council is looking into purchasing air purifiers for the elderly to help with air quality," says Shawna Jardine, Innovation Marketing Specialist - Community. "It truly warms my heart knowing our donation is helping fantastic people in need."

We also were able to donate \$500 to the Battlefords Agency Tribal Chiefs for food and water and \$5,000 to the Alberta Wildfires Red Cross Appeal. Our Red Cross donation tripled to \$15,000 after matching donations.
